


Around View® Monitor (AVM) with Moving Object Detection (MOD) (if so equipped)

- With the ignition switch in the ON position, the Around View Monitor is activated by pressing the CAMERA button 1, located on the control panel, or by moving the shift lever to the R (REVERSE) position. The control panel displays various views of the position of the vehicle.
- When the shift lever is in the P (PARK), N (NEUTRAL) or D (DRIVE) position and the CAMERA button 1 is pressed, the following views will display in order:





 When the shift lever is in the R (REVERSE) position and the CAMERA button (1) is pressed, the following views will display in order:



- For information regarding how to access additional viewing cycles, please see your Owner's Manual.
- The colored guide lines on the display screen indicate vehicle width and approximate distances
 to objects with reference to the vehicle body line.
 - Red 1.5 ft (0.5 m); Yellow 3 ft (1 m); Green 7 ft (2 m) and 10 ft (3 m).
- There are some areas where the system will not show objects.
 - When in the front or the rear view display, an object below the bumper or on the ground may not be viewed 02.
 - When in the bird's-eye view, a tall object near the seam of the camera viewing areas will not appear in the monitor.
- The distance between objects viewed on the AVM differs from the actual distance.
- Objects in the bird's-eye view will appear further than the actual distance.

MOVING OBJECT DETECTION (MOD)

- If the MOD system detects moving objects surrounding the vehicle, a yellow frame 1 will be displayed on the camera image and a chime sounds.
- In the bird's-eye view, a yellow frame is displayed on those camera images (front, rear, right, left) where moving objects are detected.
- When the following are displayed:
 - Blue **MOD** icon **02**: the system is operative in this view.
 - Gray MOD icon 03: the system is not operative in this view.
 - No MOD icon: the system is off. The indicator will also be off if all of the warning systems are
 deactivated using the camera settings menu.
- To temporarily turn the system on or off, touch the 04 key.



Garage Mode System

 Your vehicle's power liftgate operation can be set to stop opening at a user selected position in order to help avoid damaging the liftgate or overhead objects.

Tire Pressure Monitoring System (TPMS)

- A CHECK TIRE PRESSURE warning message will appear in the vehicle information display 11 and the low tire pressure warning light 12 will illuminate when one or more tires are low on pressure and air is needed.
 - The tire pressures should be checked when the tires are cold. The tires are considered cold after the vehicle has been parked for 3 hours or more or driven less than 1 mi (1.6 km) at moderate speeds.



- After tire pressures are adjusted, drive the vehicle at speeds above 16 MPH (25 km/h). The
 CHECK TIRE PRESSURE warning message and low tire pressure light will disappear.
- When the low tire pressure warning light flashes for 1 minute and then remains on, the TPMS is not functioning properly. Have the system checked by an INFINITI retailer.
- Tire pressure rises and falls depending on the heat caused by the vehicle's operation and the
 outside temperature. Low outside temperature can lower the temperature of the air inside
 the tire, which can cause a lower tire inflation pressure. This may cause the low tire pressure
 warning light to illuminate. If the warning light illuminates, check the tire pressure in your tires.
 - Check the tire pressure (including the spare tire) often and always prior to long distance trips.
- The Tire and Loading Information label contains valuable information. Please refer to section 9, "Technical and consumer information", in your Owner's Manual for the location of the Tire and Loading Information label.

Loose Fuel Cap

- A LOOSE FUEL CAP warning message will appear in the vehicle information display 1 when the fuelfiller cap is not tightened correctly.
- To tighten, turn the cap clockwise until a single click is heard.
- The warning message will disappear when the vehicle detects the fuel-filler cap is properly tightened and the reset button 2 is pressed.
- If the cap is not properly tightened, the Malfunction Indicator Light may illuminate.

Front Armrest/Center Console Storage Box

- To access the bottom storage bin, pull up on the driver's side lever 01.
- To access the top storage bin, pull up on the passenger's side lever 02.



INFINITI Intelligent Key System

The INFINITI Intelligent Key system allows you to lock or unlock your vehicle, open your liftgate and start the engine.

- It is important to make sure the Intelligent Key is with you (that is, in your pocket or purse).
- The operating range of the Intelligent Key is within 31.5 in (80 cm) from each request switch.
- To lock the vehicle, push either door handle request switch 10 once or press the 1 button 10 on the key fob.
- To unlock the vehicle, perform one of the following procedures:
 - Push either door handle request switch 10 once; the corresponding door will unlock. Push the door handle request switch 10 again within 1 minute; all other doors will unlock, or
 - Press the button on the key fob to unlock the driver's side door. Press the button again; all other doors will unlock.
- To open the liftgate, press the button for more than 1 second.
- The Intelligent Key can also be used to activate the panic alarm by pressing and holding the button for more than 1 second. Once activated, the panic alarm and headlights will stay on for a period of time.

INFINITI INTELLIGENT KEY BATTERY DISCHARGE

- If the battery in the Intelligent Key is almost discharged, the guide light 00 of the Intelligent Key port blinks and the Intelligent Key insertion indicator 07 is displayed in the vehicle information display.
- To start the engine under these circumstances, insert the Intelligent Key into the key port with the keyring side facing backward until it latches into place. Then push the ignition switch to start the engine.
- To remove the Intelligent Key from the port, push the ignition switch to turn the engine off and then pull the Intelligent Key out of the port.
- The Intelligent Key port does not charge the Intelligent Key battery. If you see the Intelligent Key warning light
 replace the battery in the Intelligent Key.
- Do not insert the mechanical key or other objects into the key port because it will damage the key port.












Power Liftgate

- When the liftgate is closed and locked, the liftgate will open automatically by:
 - Pushing the power liftgate switch 01 on the instrument panel.

 Pushing the liftgate opener switch 2, the liftgate must be unlocked, or you must have the Intelligent Key with you (in your pocket or purse).

 Pressing the HOLD button (3) on the INFINITI Intelligent Key for a period of time.



 When the power liftgate main switch is pushed to the OFF position, power operation is not available using the power liftgate switch on the liftgate OFF or the liftgate opener switch OFF.

Power Seat Adjustments

- To slide the seat forward or backward, push the control switch ← 101 forward or backward.
- To recline the seatback, push the switch ← → 02 forward or backward.

SEAT LIFTER

 To raise or lower the front portion or height of the seat, push the front or back end of the switch () (1)
 up or down.

Automatic Drive Positioner (if so equipped)

• Two positions for the driver's seat, steering column and outside mirrors can be stored in the automatic drive positioner memory.

SEAT MEMORY CONTROLS (if so equipped)

- Follow these procedures to set the memory positions:
 - Confirm the shift lever is in the **P (PARK)** position.
 - Push the ignition switch to the **ON** position.
 - Adjust the driver's seat, steering column and outside mirrors to the desired positions using the adjusting switches for each feature.
 - Push the **SET** switch and within 5 seconds, push the memory switch (1 or 2) for at least 1 second.
 - The indicator light on the memory switch you select will illuminate for approximately 5 seconds.
 - The driver's seat, steering column and outside mirror positions are now set to your preference.
- These memorized positions can also be linked to your INFINITI Intelligent Key.

Outside Mirror Control Switch

- To select the right or left side mirror, move the control switch 01 right or left.
- To adjust each mirror to the desired position, use the control switch 02.
- To fold the outside rearview mirrors, push the switch 03 to the **CLOSE** position and to unfold the outside rearview mirrors push the switch 03 to the OPEN position.

REVERSE TILT-DOWN FEATURE (if so equipped)

- When backing up the vehicle, the right or left outside mirror can be selected to turn downward to provide better rear visibility.
 - 1. Push the ignition switch to the **ON** position.
 - 2. Move the shift lever to the R (REVERSE) position.
 - 3. Choose the right or left outside mirror by operating the outside mirror control switch 01.

- The selected outside mirror surface moves downward.
- The control switch 01 must be in the right or left position for the reverse tilt-down feature to function.
- When one of the following conditions has occurred, the outside mirror surface will return to its original position:
 - The shift lever is moved to any position other than **R (REVERSE)**.
 - The outside mirror control switch is set to the center "neutral" position.
 - The ignition switch is pushed to the OFF position.



Starting/Stopping the Engine

- It is important to make sure the INFINITI Intelligent Key is with you (that is, in your pocket or purse).
- Depress the brake pedal.
 - If the brake pedal is not depressed, pushing the ignition switch once enters the ACC mode.
 - If the ignition switch is pushed a second time, the vehicle will enter the ON mode.
- Move the shift lever to P (PARK).
- Push the ignition switch to start the engine.

TURNING THE ENGINE OFF

- Move the shift lever to the **P (PARK)** position and apply the parking brake.
- Press the ignition switch START/STOP button to turn the engine off.

Headlight Control Switch

Turn the headlight control switch to the ∃D⊲ position
 to turn on the front parking, side marker, tail,
 license plate and instrument panel lights. Turn the switch to the

AUTOLIGHT SYSTEM

- The autolight system will automatically turn the headlights on when it is dark and off when it is light. The system will keep the headlights on for a period of time after you turn the ignition off and all doors are closed.
- To activate the autolight system, turn the headlight control switch to the **AUTO** position

 then push the ignition switch to **ON**. To deactivate the autolight system, turn the headlight control switch to the **OFF**, ∃D □ position

 position

 control switch to the **OFF**.

HIGH BEAM SELECT

- Push the headlight control switch forward 04 to select the high beam function. The blue indicator light ≣O illuminates in the instrument panel. Pull the headlight switch back to the original position to select the low beam. The blue indicator light goes off.
- Pull and release the headlight control switch 05 to flash the headlight high beams on and off.



FOG LIGHT SWITCH

- The headlights must be on and the low beams

 O selected for the fog lights to operate.
- Turn the switch (inside collar) to the ‡○ position 06
 to turn the fog lights on.
- Turn the switch (inside collar) to the OFF position to turn the fog lights off.

Windshield Wiper and Washer Switch

- Move the lever to the following positions to operate the windshield wipers:
 - Mist (MIST) One sweep operation of the front wipers.
 - Move the lever down to the **(INT)** position and then rotate the control ring **(3)** away from you to decrease the wiper delay.
 - 64 Low (LO) Front wipers operate at a continuous low-speed.
 - High (HI) Front wipers operate at a continuous high-speed.

REAR WINDSHIELD WIPER AND WASHER

- Intermittent (INT) Rear wiper operates intermittently.
- Low (ON) Rear wiper operates at a continuous low-speed.
- Rear washer () Push the lever forward to activate the rear washer. The rear wiper will operate several times.

Automatic Climate Controls

AUTO BUTTON/DRIVER'S SIDE TEMPERATURE CONTROL DIAL

- The auto mode may be used year-round. Press the AUTO button to turn the system on and the system will automatically control the inside temperature (automatic cooling and/ or dehumidified heating), air flow distribution and fan speed.
- Turn the driver's side temperature control dial to the left for cooler air or right for warmer air.

DUAL BUTTON/PASSENGER'S SIDE TEMPERATURE CONTROL DIAL

- Press the **DUAL** button to turn the passenger's side temperature controls on or off. This
 will allow the passenger's side temperature to be adjusted independently from the
 driver's side by turning the passenger's side temperature control dial.
- Turn the passenger's side temperature control dial left for cooler air or right for warmer air.

FAN SPEED CONTROL BUTTONS

To manually adjust the fan speed, press the top *+ button to increase the fan speed or
press the bottom *- button to decrease the fan speed.

OA DEFROSTING/DEFOGGING FRONT AND SIDE WINDOWS

- Press the defroster control button to turn the system on. The A/C automatically turns on when the defroster mode is selected. This feature removes humidity from the air.
- Turn the temperature control dial 01 to set the desired temperature.
- To defrost the front and side windows quickly, set the temperature controls and fan speed controls to their maximum settings.

05 MODE BUTTON

- Press the **MODE** button to cycle through the following air flow outlets:
 - Air flows from the center and side vents.
 - Air flows from the center, side and foot vents.
 - Air flows mainly from the foot vents.
 - Air flows from the defroster and foot vents.

06 DEFROSTING REAR WINDOW AND OUTSIDE MIRRORS

- Push the rear window defroster switch ### to turn the system on or off.
- This function automatically turns off after approximately 15 minutes.

1 INTAKE AIR CONTROL BUTTON

AIR RECIRCULATION

- Press the intake air control button to recirculate interior air inside the vehicle. The indicator light on the side will come on. This system is used to avoid outside odors and helps to adjust the inside vehicle temperature more effectively.
- The air recirculation mode cannot be activated when the air conditioner is in the front defrosting mode mode front defrost and foot vent mode .

OUTSIDE AIR CIRCULATION

 Press the intake air control button again to draw outside air into the passenger compartment. The indicator light on the side will come on.

AUTOMATIC INTAKE AIR CONTROL

In the auto mode, the intake air will be controlled automatically. To manually control the
intake air, press the intake air control button. To return to the automatic control mode,
press the intake air control button for about 2 seconds.

08 A/C BUTTON

Press the A/C button to turn the air conditioner system on or off. This system helps cool
and dehumidify the air inside the cabin and defog the windows.

OFF BUTTON

Press the OFF button to turn the climate control system off.

FM/AM/SiriusXM* Satellite Radio with CD/DVD Player (with Navigation System – if so equipped)

100 VOLUME/ON•OFF CONTROL KNOB

 Press the VOL/ON•OFF control knob to turn the system on or off. Turn the knob right or left to increase or decrease the volume.

SEEK•CAT AND TRACK BUTTONS

- To scan quickly through each broadcasting station, press the SEEK*CAT button or the TRACK button to stop at the previous or next broadcast station.
- For SiriusXM Satellite Radio, press the **SEEK•CAT** button or the **TRACK** button to switch to the first channel of the previous or next category.
- Press the **SEEK•CAT** button or the **TRACK** button to change tracks on a CD.
- Press and hold the SEEK-CAT button or the TRACK button to fast forward or rewind a track on a CD.

03 TUNE/FOLDER/AUDIO CONTROL KNOB

• To manually tune the radio, turn the **TUNE/FOLDER/AUDIO** knob left or right.

OA STATION PRESET BUTTONS

- Twelve stations can be set for the FM band, six for the AM band and eighteen for SiriusXM Satellite Radio.
- To store a station in a preset, you must first select a radio band by pressing the AM•FM/SAT button , then tune to the desired AM, FM or SiriusXM Satellite station.
- Then press and hold the desired station preset button (1-6) until the sound is briefly
 muted. The channel indicator will then display and the sound will resume. Programming
 is now complete.
- To retrieve a previously set station, select the radio band where the preset was stored, then press the corresponding station select button (1-6).

USB/iPod® Interface

The USB jack is located in the center console under the arm rest.

 When a compatible USB memory device or iPod[®] is plugged into the USB jack, compatible audio and video files stored on the device can be played through the vehicle's audio system and front display.

Conventional (Fixed Speed) Cruise Control

- The cruise control system enables you to set a constant cruising speed once the vehicle has reached 25 MPH (40 km/h).
- The system will automatically maintain the set speed until you tap the brake pedal, accelerate, cancel or turn the system off.
- To activate the cruise control, push the CRUISE ON/OFF switch 1. The CRUISE indicator light in the instrument panel will illuminate.
- To set cruising speed, accelerate the vehicle to the
 desired speed, push the COAST/SET switch 2 and release. The CRUISE SET indicator light in
 the instrument panel will illuminate. Take your foot off the accelerator pedal. Your vehicle will
 maintain the set speed.
- To reset at a faster cruising speed, push and hold the ACCEL/RES switch 3. When the vehicle attains the desired speed, release the switch.
- To reset at a slower cruising speed, push and hold the COAST/SET switch

 2. Release the switch when the vehicle slows to the desired speed.
- To cancel the preset speed, tap the brake pedal or push the CANCEL switch 04.
- To turn off cruise control, push the CRUISE ON/OFF switch 1. Both the CRUISE indicator light and the SET indicator light in the instrument panel will turn off.






Intelligent Cruise Control (ICC) System (if so equipped)

VEHICLE-TO-VEHICLE DISTANCE CONTROL MODE

- To set Vehicle-To-Vehicle Distance Control mode, press the CRUISE ON/OFF button 1 for less than 1.5 seconds. The CRUISE indicator light will illuminate.
- Accelerate to the desired speed.
- Push down on the COAST/SET switch 3 and release it. Cruise control will be set to the desired speed.
- Press the distance button 1/2 repeatedly to change the set distance between long, middle, and short.
- When a vehicle is not detected ahead of you in the lane, the set distance and set vehicle speed indicator lights will illuminate in set mode.











- To reset at a slower cruising speed, push and hold the COAST/SET switch . Release
 the switch when the vehicle slows to the desired speed.
- To cancel the preset speed, push the **CANCEL** switch ® or tap the brake pedal. The set vehicle speed indicator will go out.
- To turn off cruise control, press the **CRUISE ON/OFF** button **1.** The **CRUISE** indicator light **1.** in the instrument panel, will turn off.

To set conventional (fixed speed) cruise control mode:

- While cruise control is off, press the CRUISE ON/OFF button 1 and hold it down for more than 1.5 seconds. The CRUISE indicator light will illuminate.
- Accelerate to the desired speed.
- Push down on the COAST/SET switch and release it. The SET indicator light will illuminate.
 Cruise control should be set to the desired speed.

To switch between the two cruise control modes:

 When one of the two cruise modes is in use, you must turn the system off, and then turn it on again to select the other cruise control mode.

Power Outlets

- The power outlets are used for powering electrical accessories such as cellular telephones. They are rated at 12 volt, 120W (10A) maximum.
- Power outlets are located on the instrument panel
 inside the center console
 on the rear of the front console
 and in the cargo area
- To use a power outlet, open the cap.

Fuel-Filler Door

The fuel-filler door is located on the passenger's side of the vehicle.

- When the doors of the vehicle are locked or unlocked, the fuel-filler door is automatically locked or unlocked at the same time.
- To open the fuel-filler door, once unlocked, push the left side of the door and release.

Trip Computer

- When the button 1 is pressed, the following modes will appear on the vehicle information display 12:
 - **MPG** Displays the current fuel consumption.
 - MPG/MPH Displays the average fuel consumption and speed since the last reset.
 - TIME/MILES Displays the elapsed time and total distance the vehicle has been driven since the last reset.
 - **RANGE** Displays the estimated distance to empty (dte) the vehicle can be driven before refueling.
 - OUTSIDE TEMP Displays the exterior air temperature including a low temperature warning feature.





- SETTING Allows you to set reminders for alerts and maintenance intervals or change the language and units used in the system.
 - Press the O button 3 to cycle through the various setting modes.
 - Press the button 01 to choose the selected menu.
- **WARNING** This is available when a warning is present.
- Press the O button 3 for approximately 1 second to reset the currently displayed trip odometer to zero.

Bluetooth® Hands-free Phone System

SYSTEM OPERATING TIPS

- The "Help" command can be used to hear a list of available commands at any time.
- Reduce background noise as much as possible by closing windows and pointing HVAC vents away from the ceiling.
- Say commands after the tone, or press the we button to say a command at any time.

Speak naturally without long pauses and without raising your voice.

- When speaking Phonebook names, please be aware some phones require the last name to be spoken before the first name. For example, "Michael Smith" may be spoken as "Smith Michael".
- To cancel a voice recognition session, simply wait 5 seconds, say "Cancel" or "Quit", or press and hold the value button for 5 seconds.
- To increase or decrease the volume of the voice prompts, push the volume control switches __ or + on the steering wheel or turn the VOL/ON•OFF control knob on the audio system while the system is responding.
- If the voice recognition system does not recognize your voice commands, train the system using the Speaker Adaptation Mode. See your Owner's Manual for detailed information.



 - When prompted for a PIN code, enter "1234" from the handset. (The PIN code is assigned by INFINITI and cannot be changed.)



3. When the connecting is complete, the screen will return to the Phone menu display.

PHONEBOOK SETUP

- Depending on your cell phone, the system may automatically download your cell phone's entire phonebook to the vehicle's Bluetooth® system.
- If the phonebook does not download to "Phonebook", 40 entries may be created in the
 "Quick Dial". This phonebook allows a custom recording for each entry to be spoken while
 using the voice recognition system. To create the "Quick Dial":
 - 1. Push the **f** button on the steering wheel
 - 2. Select "Quick Dial".
 - 3. Select "Add New" at the top of the screen.
 - Choose the method for entering the phonebook entry. For this example, select "Enter Number by Keypad".
 - 5. Enter the digits and select "OK".




- Select "Store" and speak the custom name after the tone.
- 8. When the voicetag is successfully stored, select "OK" to save the phonebook entry.
- After the phonebook entry is saved, it will show a screen that is ready to call the number. Select "BACK" to return to the "Quick Dial".

CALLING A PHONEBOOK ENTRY:

- 1. Press the we button.
- 2. After waiting for the tone, say "Phone".
- 3. After the tone, say "Phonebook" or "Quick Dial" to select the desired phonebook.





4. After the tone, say the name of the person as shown on the vehicle's display of the phonebook. Depending on the phone, the last name of the contact may need to be spoken before the first name.

MAKING A CALL:

- 1. Press the w button.
- 2. After waiting for the tone, say "Phone".
- 3. After the next tone, say "Dial Number".
- 4. After the next tone, say "123-456-7891". You may also say the digits in groups of 3, 3 and 4, respectively. To use this group dialing method, say only the first 3 digits of the phone number instead of all 10 digits. After the system recognizes the number, it will request the next 3 digits and finally the last 4 digits.
- 5. After the system speaks the correct number and sounds the tone, say "Dial."

RECEIVING/ENDING A CALL


- To accept the call, press the button on the steering wheel or touch the "Answer" key.
 To reject the call, touch the "Reject Call" key.
- To hang-up, press the button or touch the "Hang-Up" key.

PAIRING PROCEDURE

- 1. Press the web button on the steering wheel. The system announces the available commands.
- Say "Connect Phone". The system acknowledges the command and announces the next set of available commands.
- Say "Add Phone". The system acknowledges the command and asks you to initiate connecting from the phone handset.
- 4. Initiate pairing from the phone.
 - The connecting procedure varies according to each cellular phone model.

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5. The system asks for a name for the phone. Say "Yes". The system acknowledges the command and registers the cellular phone.

PHONEBOOK

- Depending on the phone, the system may automatically download the entire phonebook. For more information, please visit www.InfinitiUSA.com/bluetooth or the phone's user guide.
- If the phonebook does not download automatically, 40 entries can be individually downloaded. To manually download entries:
 - 1. Push the ℓ_{m} button on the steering wheel
 - 2. After the tone, say "Phonebook".
 - 3. After the next tone, say "Transfer Entry".
 - 4. Using the phone, select an entry to send to the vehicle. Please consult the website above or your phone's User Guide for specific steps of your phone.
 - 5. The system will speak the transferred entry. Confirm the entry by saying "Yes" after the tone.

CALLING A PHONEROOK ENTRY:

- In some cases, names stored using all UPPERCASE letters may not be recognized by the voice recognition system.
 - 1. Press the 🖍 button.
 - 2. After waiting for the tone, say "Call".
 - 3. After the next tone, speak a name of a phonebook entry. For example "Michael Smith".
 - 4. Confirm the correct name is recognized by saying "Dial" after the tone.

MAKING A CALL:

- 1. Press the fix button.
- 2. After waiting for the tone, say "Call".
- 3. After the next tone, say "Phone Number".
- 4. After the next tone, say "123- 456- 7890". You may also say the digits in groups of 3, 3 and 4, respectively. - Your Navigation System can calculate a route from the current location to a preferred destination.
 The real-time map display and turn-by-turn voice guidance will lead you along the route.
- The Navigation System will continually update your vehicle's position. If you have deviated from the original route, it will recalculate the route from your current location.
- 01 Touch screen display
- DEST button Press to enter a destination.
- STATUS button Press multiple times to display audio information with either the air conditioner status, fuel economy or navigation directions.
- **200M OUT** button Press to zoom the map out.
- **ROUTE** button Press to access the guidance control functions (guidance cancellation, route priority, waypoint setting on the route, etc.).
- 06 INFINITI Controller
 - ENTER button Press to select the highlighted item on the screen. If this button is
 pressed while a map is displayed, the map menu screen is displayed.
 - Main directional buttons Use to move across the map, highlight an item on the screen or adjust a setting (volume, brightness, etc.).
 - Additional directional buttons Use to move across the map or highlight an item on the character input screen.
 - Center dial Use to highlight an item on the screen or adjust a setting. The center dial can
 also be used to adjust the map scale.

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- **INFO** button Press to display the fuel economy, tire pressure, maintenance, location, traffic information (if so equipped) and weather information (if so equipped).
- button Press to switch between the day screen (bright) and the night screen (dark). Press and hold to turn off the display. Press again to turn on the display.
- OP ZOOM IN button Press to zoom the map in.
- **MAP** button Press to display the map. While following a programmed route, press multiple times to change the type of route information displayed.
- **SETTING** button Press to access the system settings.
- BACK button Press to return to the previous screen. In a settings screen, this button is also used to apply the setting. In a character input screen, this button is also used to delete the characters that have been entered.
- **13 VOICE** button Press to hear the current guidance for a programmed route.

DVD Player (if so equipped)

- This system allows you to play video files via a DVD or CD from the front display.
- To view movies on the front display, stop the vehicle in a safe location, move the shift lever to the
 P (PARK) position and apply the parking brake.
- To reduce driver distraction, movies will not be shown on the front display while the vehicle is in any drive position.

- The HomeLink® system can learn and consolidate the functions of up to three different hand-held transmitters, operating items such as garage doors, property gates, outdoor and indoor lights or alarm systems.
- To program the Homelink® Universal Transceiver:
 - Position the handheld transceiver 1-3 in (26-76 mm) away from the Homelink® surface, keeping the Homelink® indicator light in view.
 - Press and hold the desired Homelink® button and the handheld transmitter button simultaneously until the Homelink® indicator light flashes slowly and then rapidly.
 - Both buttons may be released when the indicator light flashes rapidly.
- To verify the programing is complete, press and hold the Homelink® and observe the indicator light:
 - A solid continuous light indicates the programing is complete and the Homelink® button will activate your device.
 - A blinking light that turns to a solid continuous light after 2 seconds indicates additional steps are required to complete the programing.
- An additional person may make the remaining steps easier. To complete the programing process:
 - At the receiver of the device that you are programing to the Homelink®, press and release the "learn" or "smart" button (the name may vary by manufacturer but it is usually located near where the hanging antenna wire is attached to the unit). You have approximately 30 seconds to initiate the following step.
 - Press and hold the programmed Homelink® button for 2 seconds and release.
- Repeat the previous 2 steps up to 3 times to complete the programming process.
 Homelink® should now activate your device.
